## Ira Davenport SNF/Taylor Health Center Visitation Guidelines

Effective January 18, 2022, we are revising our visitation times to incorporate the following: Taylor Health Center must verify that visitors have received a negative SARS-CoV-2 test result **one day prior to visitation for antigen tests and two days prior to visitation for NAAT (e.g. PCR) tests.** All visitors may use either NAAT testing or antigen testing.

Our guidelines are summarized below:

- 1. Visitors must have a negative COVID test prior to visitation.
- 2. If a visitor does not have proof of a valid negative test within the required timeframe, the visitor should test him/herself at the facility.
- 3. Visitation will be as follows:
- 4. Monday 9:00 AM 4:00 PM
  - Tuesday 9:00 AM 4:00 PM
  - Wednesday 9:00 AM 8:00 PM
    - Thursday 9:00 AM 4:00 PM
    - Friday 9:00 AM 4:00 PM
    - Saturday 10:00 AM 8:00 PM (requires prior negative test on Friday)
- 5. Visitors must wear a surgical mask and sanitize their hands before visitation. You may bring food or drink to the resident. We ask that you do not eat in the room.
- 6. Vaccinated residents can have in-room visitation. If an unvaccinated resident shares a room with another resident, the unvaccinated resident will have visitation in the designated visitation area.
- 7. Surgical mask (covering mouth and nose) and physical distancing at least 6 feet between resident and visitor. You may wear a cloth mask over your surgical mask.
- 8. Please travel to and from your designated visitation area, and refrain from other travel around the building
- 8. At the direction of the NYS Department of Health, if you don't follow the visitation guidelines, you will be prohibited from visitation for the duration of the COVID-19 state declared Public Health Emergency. We ask for your cooperation for the safety of your loved one and yourself.
- 9. No pets at this time.

If we have to suspend visitation, we will notify you via email, post it on the Arnot website, or call you if you don't have an email listed with us.
